

Thomas A. Morrison

In 2009, Dr. Thomas A. Morrison was appointed as Indiana University's new Vice President for Capital Projects and Facilities. In this position, Tom Morrison serves as IU's chief capital, facilities, planning, and real estate officer overseeing all facility related operations, acquisitions, and capital projects. Previously, Morrison served as Indiana University's chief liaison and representative to the Indiana General Assembly and other State agencies as Associate Vice President for Public Affairs and State Relations. He continues to serve as a liaison to State and Federal agencies for all capital related items.

Prior to coming to Indiana University, Tom was Ball State University's Associate Vice President for Business Affairs, where he had been at the 18,000-student school for 17 years. In addition to representing Ball State in several legislative sessions, he held a wide variety of other administrative responsibilities. During the 2007-08 academic year, he served as the university's interim chief financial and administrative officer. Through his years at Ball State, Morrison held responsibility for facilities management and strategic planning, development of capital budgets, government relations, auxiliary services, and human resources.

At IU, Morrison has overseen the completion of the IUB Multi Disciplinary Science Building; IUB Cinema and Theater; IUB Union Street Center Housing; the Memorial Stadium North End-zone addition; IUPUI Walther Hall; IUPUI Gateway Garage; and IUSB Harper Hall. He also worked with the Indiana General Assembly to secure funding for several major projects at IU and Ball State. In 2009, Indiana University was granted authority for several new and renovation capital projects totaling nearly \$200 million. Among those authorized were the Cyberinfrastructure Building at IUB; Neurosciences Building at IUPUI; Tamarack Hall at IUN; Education and Arts Building at IUSB; Education and Technology Building at IUS; and laboratory renovations at both IUB and IUPUI.

At Ball State, Morrison was involved in projects that included the Art and Journalism Building, Music Instruction Building, the Letterman Communication Media Building, the boiler and chiller plant renovation and central campus renovation project. He also was instrumental in procuring several federally funded projects, including the McKinley/Riverside Avenue reconstruction project. Before Ball State University, Morrison was assistant director for intramural-recreational sports and facilities manager for intercollegiate athletics at the University of Virginia.

Tom Morrison holds a doctorate in higher education administration from Ball State University, a masters degree from the University of Maryland and a bachelors degree from the University of Denver. He and his wife, Kathryn, have three children. In his spare time, he serves as a technical race official for the Indycar Series and the Indianapolis 500.
